INTERNSHIP PROGRAM 2026

The National Bighorn Sheep Center is dedicated to educating the public about bighorn sheep and the conservation of wildlife and wildlands. We inspire, educate, and conserve through our exhibits, programs, and outreach, with a commitment to wild sheep since 1993. We offer one internship for undergraduate students at the University of Wyoming studying environmental and natural resource fields.

SUMMARY OF POSITION:

The intern will be responsible for implementing educational programs and outreach events at the Center and off-site expos. S/he will provide support in the museum and gift shop around tours, admissions, and sales, in addition to completing off-site shadowing.

SPECIFIC DUTIES AT CENTER:

- Lead youth activities and tours on- and off-site, including programs such as Roads Scholars Bus Tours, summer camps, and Camp Bighorn at the Whiskey Mountain Conservation Camp
- Assist in admissions, gift shop sales, general visitor services, and Center upkeep, as needed
 - Welcome visitors and take admissions, with a strong commitment to welcoming, encouraging, and engaging with people of all backgrounds
 - Provide basic wildlife and bighorn sheep biology information, as well as information about the local area and Center's mission in a polite and professional manner
- Assist in the preparation for and hosting of special events, including marketing, coordination, set up, and cleanup
- Shadow a variety of professionals in the field, as organized by the intern and the Center
- Share intern experience in a webinar at the end of the summer

OTHER DUTIES/RESPONSIBILITIES/REQUIREMENTS

- Agree to complete a criminal background check
- Adhere to employee handbook and organization's dress code
- Travel around the state to assist in educational outreach
- Individual may be required to use personal laptop/technology

DETAILS:

- Eligible candidates will have completed their sophomore, junior, or senior year of undergraduate education at the University of Wyoming. The Center will select individuals who have excelled in their studies, have a passion for wildlands and wildlife, and aspire to build a career informing and educating the public about conservation and education of our wildlands and wildlife.
- The position runs from May-August at approximately 30 hours/week.
- Internship position pays \$5800
